duced sheep (except rams which are individually inspected) are isolated until after a spread season has passed and ad for footrot lesions and their severity before introducing them to the existing flock.

y on the property is inspected and maintained to prevent straying and allow for isolation.

nd/or grids (to grazing areas) are kept closed and maintained.

heep stray onto this property (or return from straying off of the property) they are kept isolated from the rest of the flock appropriate inspection and/or treatment undertaken.

- Throughout the year lame sheep and/or sheep with overgrown or misshapen hooves in this flock have been inspected for signs of benign or virulent footrot.
- This flock is inspected annually for footrot, during the most likely footrot spread period.
- Footrot is not known to occur on this property. No visible signs of benign or virulent footrot have been found at inspections and there is no history of suspicion.
- This flock has been inspected for footrot at least every two years by an accredited assessor, during the most likely footrot spread period.
- At the most recent footrot inspection by an accredited assessor, no visible signs of benign or virulent footrot were found.
